The Year of the Inventory? 2005-2006 will surely see Authorities turning their attention to inventory data collection. Highway Asset Management plans are required for all authorities throughout the UK by 2006 and the supporting documentation has now been published. The time for action has arrived.

Asset Data Collection and Presentation

Blackpool Council and one London Borough have installed pilot versions of the software and are undertaking trials of its capabilities on selected parts of their networks. Mouchel Parkman now



uses the system as a key element of their contract with the London Borough of Ealing and has customised parts of the system to simplify their working procedures with their term contractor.

Consultancy – Highway Asset Management Plans

Work is ongoing with the production of a **Code of Practice** and **Inspection Manual** to be used by the highway inspectors and also to provide information to the public.
